WE ARE RECONCILED TO GOD

Advent candle lighting - our confession and assurance <u>Reader 1</u>: Fire burns. It can destroy; but it also gives warmth and light. The coming of Christ will be both a day of judgment and a day of great promise.

<u>Reader 2</u>: Lighting a candle in the darkness helps us find our way. In darkness we can lose direction, not recognizing where we have been, or seeing where we are going. But a single light can point us forward to a radiant future.

<u>All:</u> "Stir up your might, and come to save us. Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved" (Psalm 80:2b-3).

(The first candle is lit.)
